# "THE BUMPS ARE WHAT YOU CLIMB ON"

## JAMES 1;2-4; I PET. 1:5-7

- **Jas. 1:2-4** "My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; <u>Knowing</u> <u>this</u>, that the <u>trying you your faith worketh patience</u>. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye <u>may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing</u>".
- **I Peter 5:6-7** "Wherein in ye greatly rejoice, though now <u>for a season</u>, <u>if need be</u>, ye are in <u>heaviness through manifold temptations</u>: That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, <u>might be found unto</u> praise and honor and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ."

### **INTRODUCTION:**

- A. Careful reading of the text reveals that both James and Peter <u>echo the same</u> <u>attitude toward temptation and trials</u>, **AND** their benefit in the believer's life, <u>for the</u> <u>present and the future</u>.
- 1. Could it be they had discovered that "THE BUMPS ARE WHAT YOU CLIMB ON"? Let me explain with the following story:

A <u>young boy</u> had talked his little sister into climbing up a mountain that was near their home. In an effort to convince her that she could do it with him, he told her that there was even a path to follow. <u>Finally he succeeded!</u>

As he was leading her up the mountain path, **one that she found was not too easy to climb,** she complained, "Why, this isn't a path at all, it's all rocky and bumpy!" Her brother replied, "Sure, but **the bumps are what you climb on**."

- 2. When we think about it, his was a remarkable piece of philosophy. What do you do with the bumps on the path of life. Give Title of Message
- B. <u>Read any successful person's biography</u> and you will find there is <u>not one whose</u> life was free from problems and difficulties.
- 1. While looking at their life from a distance, you <u>might think</u> they had it made and that life was easy for them.
- a. **But when you get closer**, you discover that their climb to the top was not an easy one.
- b. Their life or path was rocky and bumpy, but the bumps were what they climbed on to get to the top!
  - 2. One doesn't have to read far in the Bible before discovering this truth.
- 3. Let's look at a few of those considered by most OF US to have made it to the top of the spiritual mountain.

#### LABRAHAM'S CLIMB TO THE TOP.

A. Abraham didn't become a great man of faith overnight. He was required to go

through some <u>difficult tests on the path of life</u> before reaching the top of the mountain. **Five bumps in his life are:** 

- 1. No sooner did he arrive in Canaan than a famine came to the land. <u>Imagine facing a famine in the land God has promised you!</u>
- 2. Afterwards he had problems with his nephew, Lot, and his herds-men, and in the end wound up giving Lot the most fertile and productive land, EVEN THOUGH the Lord had promised it to Abraham personally.

- 3. Then came war to the land, and Abraham had to go out and fight to protect what God had promised him.
- 4. Sarah, his wife, later led him astray with bad counsel and the <u>result</u> was the birth of Ishmael, a son who brought sorrow to his heart and home.
- 5. <u>Finally</u>, Isaac, the promised son, was born, bringing great joy to Abraham and Sarah. **But then**, God asked Abraham to offer Isaac on the altar for a sacrifice, a task that would be difficult for <u>any father or mother</u>.
- B. Yes, there were <u>many bumps in Abraham's life</u>, but he used them to climb <u>higher</u>!! **II. JOSEPH'S CLIMB TO THE TOP INCLUDED SEVEN BUMPS.** 
  - A. If anybody had a rocky road, Joseph certainly did.
- 1. He was <sup>1</sup>-pampered by his father!? <sup>2</sup>-Hated by his brothers. <sup>3</sup>-Sold for a slave, <sup>4</sup>-falsely accused by Potiphar's wife, <sup>5</sup>-thrown into prison, <sup>6</sup>-forgotten by Pharaoh's servants, and <sup>7</sup>-appparently forsaken for two years.
- 2. **BUT**, the bumps on the path of life helped him to climb higher, and one day Joseph became second in command of all Egypt.
  - a. He went from the prison to the palace. Where is God trying to take you??
  - B. Others to climb on bumps included: Moses, David, Daniel, Paul, and many others.
- 1. They were apparently people who did not complain about the road; but accepted the difficulties of life and <u>used them as stepping stones</u> to the top of the spiritual mountain, as well as the mountain of success in life
- C. I may not know what difficulties you are going through just now, **BUT**, I know some of the feelings you are experiencing.
  - 1. **How?** Because I have been on this bumpy road myself. <u>I like you have:</u>
  - 2. Felt like quitting, like giving up.
- 3. I've had difficulty understanding why the road doesn't get easier, why God doesn't remove the stones and straighten the path. GUESS WHAT??
- 4. If God did remove the stones and straighten the path we might never go any higher nor get to the top, because the bumps are what we climb on!
- 5. They're just another opportunity to prove to the world and to Satan that God knows best and that His Grace is sufficient.

# III. IN PSALMS 91, DAVID MAGNIFIES THE CARE THAT GOD EXERCISES OVER HIS CHILDREN. In it David begins by saying:

**Ps. 91:1** "He that dwelleth in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.

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
